Kevin C. Chung, MD, MS, the Charles B. G. De Nancrede Professor of Surgery, Plastic Surgery and Orthopaedic Surgery, received his health services research training as a Robert Wood Johnson Clinical Scholar from the University of Michigan. He obtained his general surgery training from the University of Texas in San Antonio, his plastic surgery training from the University of Michigan and his hand surgery training from the Curtis National Hand Center in Baltimore. Dr Chung is Chief of Hand Surgery for Michigan Medicine and Director of the Comprehensive Hand Center.

Dr. Chung was the 75th President in 2020 for the American Society for Surgery of the Hand. He was past President of the Plastic Surgery Foundation. He has published over 750 peer-reviewed manuscripts (over 33,000 citations, H index 88), over 470 book chapters, and 29 textbooks. He has had continuous funding from the National Institutes of Health for over 20 years. Dr. Chung is the Editor for Hand Clinics, the Editor-in-Chief for Grabb and Smith 8th Edition, past Deputy Editor for the Journal of Hand Surgery (American) and Associate Editor for Journal of Hand Surgery (European). He is the Editor-in-Chief of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery, the leading journal of this specialty for over 75 years.

## **Tord Skoog (1915-1977)**

Tord Skoog was the founder of the plastic surgery department in Uppsala in 1951 and was appointed the first full professor of plastic surgery in Scandinavia in 1961. He was a native of Uppsala with a MD in 1943 at Uppsala University. He trained in Sweden, Finland, and 1946 in England with Sir Harold Gillies and Sir Archibald McIndoe. In 1948 his thesis on Dupuytren's contracture generated an international impact. He was an honorary fellow of several national societies and an Honorary Fellow of the American College of Surgeons as well as appointed Commodore, First Class, of the Finnish Order by the president of Finland

Skoog's contributions to plastic surgery were vast and influenced by his visionary mind and artistic talent. He was a true pioneer in many fields of plastic surgery e.g. hand surgery, burns, breast surgery, cleft, lip and palate surgery and facial surgery. Skoog's international contacts especially after the first international congress of plastic surgery in Stockholm-Uppsala 1955 made him an educator of many surgeons from all over the world who came to Uppsala to learn from him over the coming years.
